

The Month of May

May is the fifth month of the year in the <u>Julian</u> and <u>Gregorian Calendars</u> and the third of seven months to have a length of 31 days.

May is a month of <u>spring</u> in the Northern Hemisphere and <u>autumn</u> in the Southern Hemisphere. Therefore, May in the <u>Southern Hemisphere</u> is the seasonal equivalent of <u>November</u> in the Northern Hemisphere and vice versa. Late May typically marks the start of the summer vacation season in the United States and Canada and ends on <u>Labor</u> <u>Day</u>, the first Monday of September.

The month of May (in Latin, <u>Maius</u>) was named for the <u>Greek Goddess</u> <u>Maia</u>, who was identified with the <u>Roman</u> <u>era goddess</u> of fertility, <u>Bona Dea</u>, whose festival was held in May. Conversely, the Roman poet <u>Ovid</u> provides a second etymology, in which he says that the month of May is named for the *maiores*, Latin for "elders," and that the following month (June) is named for the *iuniores*, or "young people" (*Fasti VI.88*).

<u>Mayovka</u>, in the context of the late <u>Russian Empire</u>, was a <u>picnic</u> in the countryside or in a park in the early days of May, hence the name. Eventually, "mayovka" (specifically, "proletarian mayovka") came to mean an illegal celebration of <u>May 1</u> by revolutionary public, typically presented as an innocent picnic.^[1]

Special devotions to the Virgin Mary take place in May. See May devotions to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

<u>Eta Aquariids</u> meteor shower appears in May. It is visible from about April 21 to about May 20 each year with peak activity on or around May 6. The <u>Arietids</u> shower from May 22 – July 2, and peaks on June 7. The <u>Virginids</u> also shower at various dates in May.


