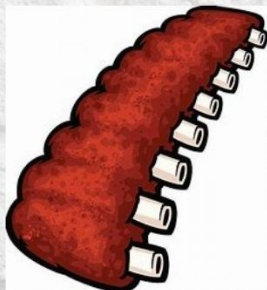

## Cheryl's Dugout Chat

After some technical issues this summer Cheryl's Dugout Chat is back. With all the gardens, farmer's markets and grocery stores supplying some great produce I thought a Nutritional article would be appropriate ( I need to do something with those Covid pounds that have found me). As always check with your Dr. before making changes to your diet/plan.

Apples: 1 a day can lower your bad cholesterol and raise the good cholesterol and high in fiber.

Broccoli, spinach, avocados, sunflower and pumpkin seeds, almonds: are all great sources of magnesium. this can be therapeutic and is helpful for migraines, cardiovascular, osteoporosis, diabetes and a skin booster

Apricots: high in fiber, potassium, vitamin A,C,E antioxidant and has beta-carotene

Thomcord Grapes: high in potassium, Vitamins B,K. Only available July-Sept.

Cucumbers: helps with swelling, hydrates (95% water) and reduce those facial lines

Tomatoes: Vitamin C, A and antioxidants has lycopene which is helpful for Cancer

Zucchini: part of the squash family and has pectin which is a fiber, can also lower cholesterol and increase a healthy heart

Watermelon: high water content to stay hydrated, also has lycopene which protects skin cells from sun damage and has Vitamin A

Oranges: rich in potassium, helps prevent muscle cramps, and are 80% water

Celery and Fennel: diuretics that helps you lose excess weight with out causing dehydration, flushes your kidneys to help eliminate bloating

Cantaloupe and Honey Dew: Vitamin A, diuretic, important for women with hormonal issues

Black/Red Raspberries: great sources of fiber, high in Vitamin C and 8 grams of fiber per cup

Nectarines: Vitamin A, great fiber source and has antioxidant beta-carotene

Peaches: Vitamin C

Spinach/Kale: carotenoids in orange and dark leafy greens which converts to Vitamin A which protects skin form sun damage and mends flaky/dry skin.

Salmon: high carotenoid food which converts to Vitamin A, high in Omega 3, helps reduce heart disease.

Green Tea: studies have shown its helpful in fighting cancer, heart disease, lowering bad cholesterol, revise your metabolism, keep dementia @ bay, cools down your body on hot days when iced.

Strawberries/Blueberries: full of flavonoids a powerful disease fighter. They increase blood flow, decrease sensitivity to light which improves your skin's appearance and texture. Studies have shown they possibly slow cognitive decline.

Avocados: great for your heart and powerful for lowering bad cholesterol

Turnips: loaded with fiber, magnesium, potassium, iron, calcium, copper, phosphorus, Omega 3 fatty acids, protein and Vitamins A,C,E,K,B1,B2,B3,B5,B6

Rutabaga: great source of potassium, calcium, magnesium, Vitamins E,C high in fiber and also a antioxidant.

Romaine Lettuce: the most nutritious of all lettuce, full of folate, potassium and beta carotene.

Carrots: great source of beta-carotene, fiber, potassium, antioxidant, and Vitamin K1

Dandelion Greens: great source of calcium and Vitamin K of which both help prevent bone loss. A good fiber that helps improve digestion and healthy gut bacteria.

Red Radish: Vitamins A,E,C,B6,K. High source of fiber, since, potassium, copper, calcium, iron manganese, antioxidants which all work together to keep your body in good working condition.

Arugula: high in cancer fighting, fiber and phytochemical (plant compounds to protect cells), very low in sugar, calories, carbohydrates and fat.

Nuts: handful of almonds, cashews, peanuts, walnuts help lower bad cholesterol

# 2020 Census

Just a friendly reminder, if you haven't already completed the Census form, please take time to do so.

The current national census response rate is 62.7% and more than 92.7 million households have completed their Census questionnaires.

**Alaska's response rate is the lowest among the states at 49.1%. In 2010, the state response rate was 55.6%. Our communities are counting on us to do better!**

As of today, the top 15 boroughs with the highest self-response rates in Alaska are (expressed in percentage): Juneau- 64.4, Anchorage- 61.9, Sitka- 54.5, Ketchikan Gateway- 54.0, Kodiak Island- 51.4, Petersburg- 49.6, Fairbanks North Star- 48.3, Kenai Peninsula- 39.8, Wrangell- 38.2, Mat-Su- 34.0, Bethel- 31.6, Haines- 30.1, Aleutians East- 29.2, North Slope- 28.9, Hoonah-Angoon- 28.6.

Special congratulations to the following boroughs for meeting or surpassing their 2010 response rates: Juneau (59.4% in 2010), Sitka (49.6 in 2010), Ketchikan (44.9 in 2010), Kodiak Island (45.5 in 2010), and Fairbanks North Star (48.3 in 2010).

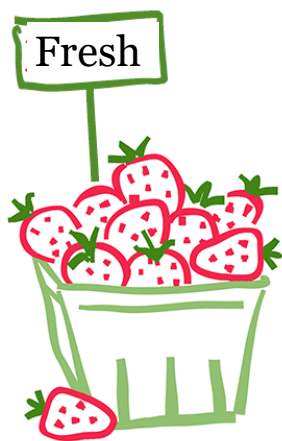
## Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Program

### **COVID-19 virus:**

- ♦ All Senior Center activities have been postponed until further notice.
- ♦ Take-Out meals are available from 11:30 am—12:30 pm. We ask that you call by 10 am to request a meal for that day. Meals will be delivered through the front door. We ask that you stay in your car and we will bring the meal out to you. Meals include the main entrée and soup. Suggested donation is \$5.
- ♦ Home delivered meals will continue as usual. If you are a Senior and are unable to come and pick up a meal, we would be happy to deliver the meal to you if you're within 5 miles of the senior center. If you are outside of the 5 mile radius, we have other options, please call us for more information. To limit contact, the driver will knock on your door and then leave the bagged meal outside for you to pick up.
- ♦ We will be in the office daily from 9-3 for in-person information and any needed services (copying, faxing, notary, etc.). We are requesting that you limit your access to the center. If your questions can be handled via the phone, please call us. If not, please call ahead and set up an appointment to ensure we are able to meet your needs when you're here.
- ♦ Transportation services to take people into town for shopping are limited at this time. For those wishing to order ahead of time, we are happy to pick up groceries and/or prescriptions. Please schedule pickups for Tuesday as much as possible, as that is our normal "town" day. Fred Meyer, Safeway, and Walmart offer pickup at the store when you place an order online.

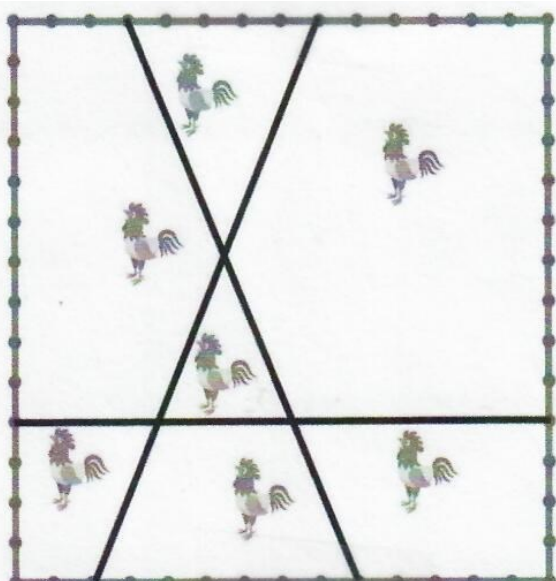
