Richard Hawkins ~ Incumbent President

My name is Dick Hawkins. I was raised in Ninilchik and, after retiring, my wife and I moved back and I built a house on our old homestead property at mile 126, Sterling Hwy.

I have been a member of the Senior Center since I retired in 2006. My first position on the board was as Vice President and after one term, I was elected President. For those who have been looking in their freezers and have found last year's raspberries or blueberries on the bottom I have a drink recipe for you.

2 cups crushed berries	6 cups of strong tea	1 cup of lemon juice
1 cup of sugar or sugar substitute	ice cubes or cubes of frozen berry juice

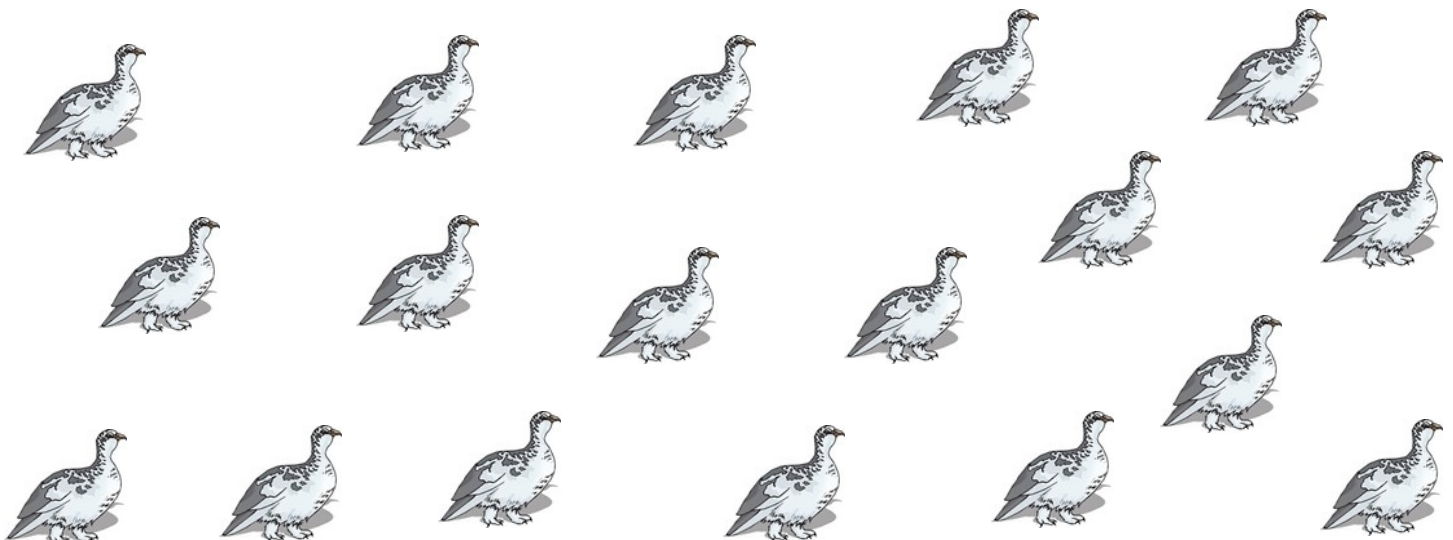

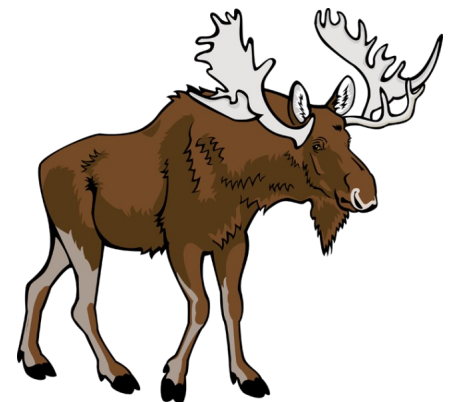
