

## JULY DUGOUT NEWS

Summer is here and it's time to think about those Spring and Summer Cleanings. Here's a few shortcuts!

**Wipe out Wall Scuffs:** Use a cleaning paste to easily rub out blemishes on painted walls and baseboards. Apply it with a damp cloth, then rinse with a cloth and wipe dry.

**Deep clean the sofa:** remove the couch cushions and thoroughly vacuum all the folds and crevices. Flip and reposition the cushions if possible. For a sofa bed, unfold the mattress and vacuum it too.

**Revive Curtains:** Use your vacuum's upholstery tool to dust fabric drapes and valances. Be sure to hit all the folds and pleats.

**Renew your Floors:** Dip a damp paper towel (or your finger) into baking soda and rub out floor scuffs. Wipe with a damp cloth and buff dry.

**Dust Your Blinds:** Use a microfiber glove or rag and wipe down window slats. Lastly use it to dust the drapery rods and rings.

**Rub Lampshades Clean:** Use a sticky lint roller to quickly remove dust and hair from smooth lampshades. Clean pleated shades with a new bristle or foam paintbrush.

**Scour Shower Nozzles:** You can restore the flow to clogged sprayers and faucets using a small brush dipped into white vinegar. Go into and around the holes. Run the hot water to rinse.

**Grout:** whiten mildewy looking grout at the corners of a tub or shower floor with a cotton ball soaked in chlorine bleach. Keep the wet cotton against the stain until it disappears.

**Fans:** Gather the dust that clogs a bathroom exhaust fan with your vacuum's soft brush attached to the extension wand. Clean the brush as needed to thoroughly clean the fan.

**Filters:** Replace your furnace or AC filters. For your range hood filter soak it for about 15 minutes in the sink of hot water, 1/2 cup baking soda and a grease cutting dish liquid. Scrub gently with a dish brush. Rinse, dry and replace in range hood.

**Vacuum Cleaner:** Take apart the dust bin and filter assembly and wash and dry all pieces thoroughly. Tap clean or replace any non-washable filters. Check the brush roller for tangles and clear them with scissors or a seam ripper. DO NOT USE A KNIFE!

**Toaster:** Slide out the crumb tray from your toaster or toaster oven (and any pans or racks) and wash in warm suds. Use a pastry brush, whisk stuck-on bits from inside the appliance. Turn it over to dump them out (toaster).

**Refrigerator:** using a disinfecting wipe gently wipe between the gasket channel and use a dry paper towel afterwards. (Great place for mold to grow). May need to use several disinfecting wipes.

**Washer:** Pop out your machine's detergent dispenser. Disassemble it and scrub away gunk under running water with a soft brush. Clean the rubber gasket with a disinfecting wipe. Good time to check your water connections to make sure they haven't loosened.

**Dryer:** Pull or suck out clumps from inside your dryer's lint filter chamber then clean under, around and behind your dryer with a long, flat dusting tool. Check connections to make sure your lint hose is connected tightly to dryer and outside vent.


